

**Men's Captain & Club Coach,  
Des Eggitt, urges a more competitive  
approach**

**MY RECENT** enforced layoff, while recovering from the operation on my hand, gave me the unusual opportunity to act as a spectator at a number of games. As a result, I was able to assess more closely than usual the way in which our players approach their games.

I was surprised, and not a little disappointed, to note just how many players fail to engage fully in the match in which they are involved. Evidence of this is provided in a number of ways:

- \* Players delivering their woods and then "retiring" to the benches without staying on the green to observe how their colleagues are performing.
- \* Players turning their backs on a poorly delivered wood - or even a good wood - before the wood has come to rest and before they have received a reactive signal from the Skip.
- \* Players who clearly take no interest in how the overall match score is developing
- \* Players who fail to note carefully the line adopted by their opposite number in order to have a chance of assessing how a green is playing.
- \* Players who consistently ignore directions from their Skip by turning a blind eye to any signals on how a shot is to be played.
- \* Leads who, having seen the opposition get close to the jack, use their own woods to try to dislodge the "shot" rather than concentrating on achieving a good second wood by a good draw shot.
- \* Leads who change their hand - even after a decent draw shot with the first wood - rather than staying on the same hand to benefit from what the first wood has taught them.

These practices, in themselves, perhaps, are insignificant, but the cumulative effect is to reduce the competitive nature of the game in hand and, far too often, lead to dropped shots through wasted opportunities - and hence into games lost that might have been won.

A quick analysis of our results this Season

demonstrates an average deficit of fewer than 10 shots per match. I strongly believe that, by paying attention to the points I raised here, we can readily make up that small deficit and turn losses into wins.

No-one wants to turn our Club into a group of "pot hunters" nor do we wish, in any way, to lose sight of the fact that enjoyment of the game and of the opportunities for socialising that the game offers should remain our primary focus. Nevertheless, with very little effort - and without threat to our principles - we can and ought to be able to record a higher degree of success than we currently achieve. And that can only add to the enjoyment we take from our participation.

**An appeal for  
greater co-operation**

**LATE** in the Season it may be - but it is not too late to remind Members of the need regularly to check and fill in the Availability Sheets to signal availability for selection.
